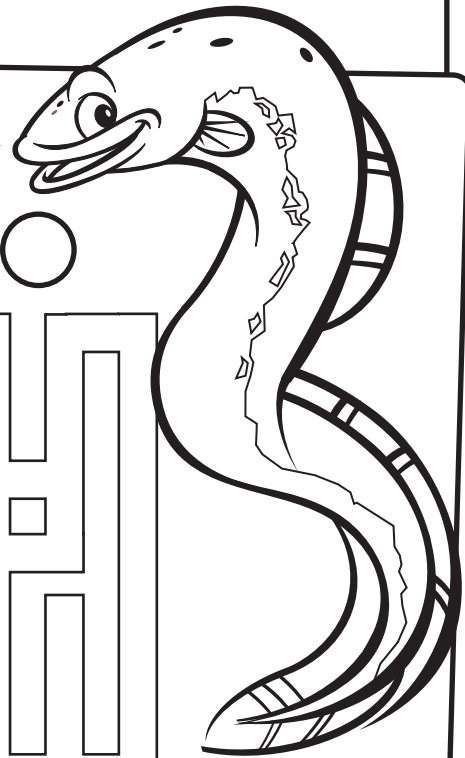
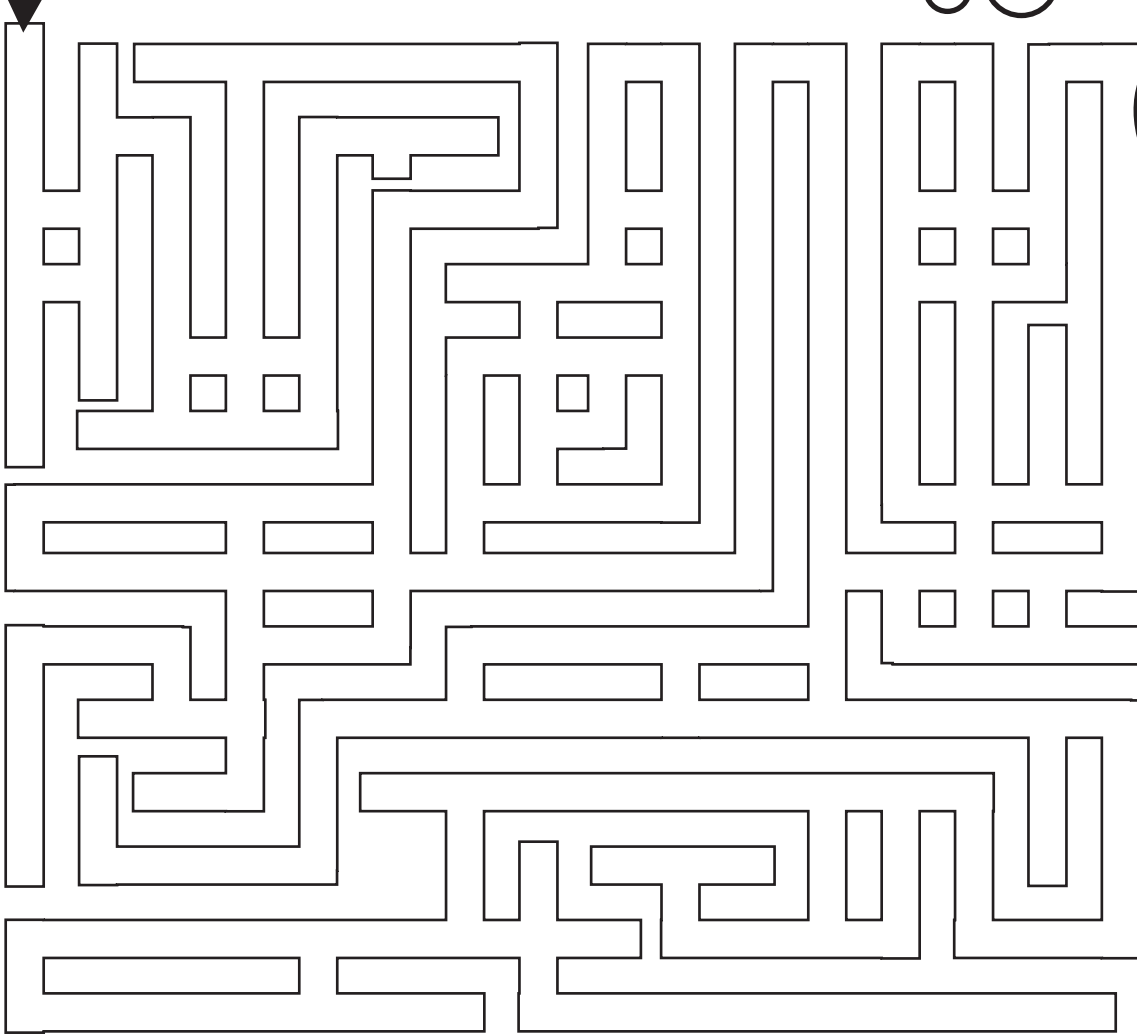

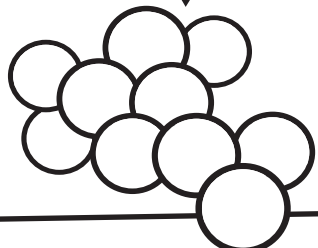
Help me get to a safe place near Tonga to lay my eggs ...
